


What then, is the foundation or root of our beginning and build from there? We have all heard the phrase 'Freedom is not Free'. That is perhaps one of the first truth we as Americans learned. Freedom costs someone something and we are the beneficiaries of that cost. Our nation was built by those who had the courage to endure hardships, failures, and reputational risks. Today, that honor is being threatened. Not from the outside, but from

inside. So, let's get started!

Can you imagine what it was like to see the star that foretold the birth of Jesus? Maybe it was like this.

My name is Darian, I'm a student of the Magi. I was so excited to be chosen to be a student of these wise men. Little did I know that my job was to stare at the sky night after night after night and report back to them if anything out of the ordinary was seen. So, this is what I did every night until sunrise. It would change a little as the night went on toward sunrise and occasionally, I would see a shooting star.

Nearly 600 years ago, after the Jews became enslaved here, in Babylon, there was a prophet named Daniel. When the Hebrews came here, they renamed them all. They renamed Daniel - Belteshazzar. King Darius was tricked into signing a law that for 30 days no one was to pray to anyone, devine or human, except to him. (Daniel 6:1-28) The King reluctantly was forced to throw him into a lions' den because he continued to pray to his God. The next morning the king went out to the lion's den and cried out "Was your God, whom you serve faithfully able to rescue you from the lions" Daniel responded "My God sent angel to shut lions' mouths so that they would not hurt me." The King decreed that everyone should tremble with fear before the God of Daniel.



As you can imagine, he became very well-known and respected. He became Chief of the Magi and taught the Law of Moses and the prophets.

It has been so long since the King Cyrus allowed the Jews to return home and to rebuild the temple. Alexander, the King of Macedonia, conquered most of the known world, and the Greeks and others had their influence too. Now, the Romans are the dominant force. The Magi believed the time had come for a sign in the sky to tell them that the King of the Jews, had been born.

Then one night I saw this brilliant star in the sky. I immediately went to the wise men, saying come and see the star that just appeared. Excitedly, they began preparing their group for a 900-mile journey west to find the child who would be the King of the Jews.

It was not uncommon for these Magi to travel to other kingdoms, meeting with kings. These were wise men held in high regard. So, when they met with King Herod, they asked, "Where is the one who has been born King of the Jews?" (Matthew 2:2) This news greatly disturbed King Herod, so he summoned the priests to gather more information about the birth of this rival king. They told him, "In Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, for this is what has been written by the prophet" [Micah 5:2].

Being a new student, it surprised me how seriously they responded to this new star. To pick up and go to, well, *I don't know*, and I am not sure they knew either. I've heard stories of how God told Abram to go to a land he promised, leaving his prosperous life behind. I'm not sure I could do that. Noah's dedication to building a boat in the desert, despite not knowing what rain was, ensured our survival.

I have a lot to learn about this kind of faith. Little did I know that on this trip, that would all change.

Upon leaving Jerusalem, the star led the way to a house. The wise men went in with their gifts, gold and frankincense, I could understand, but myrrh? They used myrrh when preparing a body for burial, did they know this child's destiny? We camped outside Bethlehem that night; they shared what they had learned about an angel visiting Mary and told her she was going to have a baby by the Holy Spirit, not by man. She was a virgin. Isaiah wrote about this also [7:14] Another angel convinced Joseph to keep her as his wife. The next morning, we are told that God had told them, in a dream, to go out a different way and avoid Harod the Great and Jerusalem.

It had been many years since the last prophet, Malichi wrote what he heard from God. Now a brilliant star in the sky, the Magi had a dream and angels had visited shepherds, too. It was obvious, that God was again involved in our lives.

Yet, he was born in a stable with the animals, not where a king would be born. What else do we know about this child that God is protecting from the Roman King?

I asked the Magi, my mentors. They had me read what the prophet Isaiah wrote, (chapter 53:3) "He was despised and rejected by mankind, a man of suffering, and familiar with pain. Like one from whom people hide their faces, he was despised, and we held him in low esteem. Surely, he took up our pain and bore our suffering, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him and afflicted."

Now, I'm more confused than before. This does not sound like any king I have heard of and why is God protecting him? It sounds like people will not like him, in fact, despise him. I continued to read 5. "But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was on him, and by his wounds, we are healed."

What is wrong with these people? He will do all of this to bring us peace and healing. 6. "All we like sheep have gone astray, each of us has turned, each one, to his own way."

He took upon himself our blame for all our sins, for all our weaknesses. If I was free of guilt, that would give me peace and so many need to be healed. I continued to read 8. "By oppression and judgement, he was taken away. Yet who of his generation protested? [His contemporaries, wait that is me] For he was cut off from the land of the living [by His death] For the transgression of my people he was punished. His was assigned a grave with the wicked, and the rich in his death, though he had done no violence, nor was any deceit in his mouth."

They put this man, this King, to death as if he had done something wrong. He didn't even lie, who hasn't lied! 12 "....For he bore the sin of many, and made intercession for transgressors."

I also read where King David wrote in Psalms 16 "I saw the Lord always before me. Because He is my right hand, I will not be shaken. Therefore, my heart is glad and my tongue rejoices; my body also will rest in hope, because you will not abandon me to the realm of the dead, you will not let your Holy One (Jesus) see decay. You have known to me the paths of life; you will fill me with joy in your presence." [Acts 2:25-28]

So, this baby, Jesus, will grow up, then he will die for our sins, then he won't stay in the place of the dead, he will be resurrected and he will know joy in the presence of God almighty. Wow, no wonder God is protecting his life from King Herod. On our way back to Babylon, we hear that the family had to flee and Harod did the unthinkable, he had all the baby boys killed. He surely is a mad man.

The prophet Hosea wrote "..out of Egypt I called my son" This is God saying this baby boy is more than just any King, he is the <u>Son of God</u>! So, God loved us so much that he sent His only son to be the final sacrifice to forgive us our sin. No one has greater love than to lay down his own life for his friends, "Behold what manner of love the Father has given unto us, that we should be called the sons of God."

I will be watching this king as he grows, I have so much more to learn, but what I know already, I believe!
